







Mosaic Tiles Unify Upscale Remodel

CHALLENGE: Completely renovate and modernize a fourstory town house in Scarsdale, N.Y.

CRITERIA: The owners, young work-at-home parents, wanted to establish dramatically different moods in the home's bathrooms. In the master bath, the goal was to create a serene spa-like retreat. For the children's bathroom, a fun, lively space for bathing and brushing teeth was envisioned. The guest bathroom called for an aura of formality and elegance.

INFLUENCES: The extensive remodel was intended to create an open and continuous design flow throughout the home. A unifying design element was needed to weave the various rooms together.

SOLUTION: Interior designer Bradley Stephens used the Classic Series of glass mosaic tiles from Hakatai to create a clean, modern aesthetic and to provide continuity in surface texture and shape. The Classic Series offers a wide selection of solid and transparent colors and mosaic blends, allowing Stephens to use a distinct color palette to enhance each individual room while tying the space together overall.

In the 400-sq.-ft. master bath, the Classic Series in a deep blue tone is the focal point. The 3/4 x 3/4-in, tiles are installed on the shower floors, walls and tub surround as well as the entire ceiling. For contrast, the sink vanity and backsplash wall are clad in mosaic tiles in china blend—a soothing combination of china, pearl and porcelain tones. For the children's bathroom, Stephens specified Hakatai's

light blue/ice green blend for the floor (a playful combination of various shades of blue, green and porcelain) and solid sky blue for the sink vanity. In the 4o-sq.-ft. guest bathroom, a combination of lush green tones is on display, with emerald tiles decorating the sink vanity and backsplash and a blend of jade and mint tiles covering the floor. To continue the unity established in the bathrooms of the home, Stephens took the tiles into the kitchen, covering the entire back wall behind the range and countertop in the Classic Series' hail blend.
