



Imagine the Possibilities

Tile mosaics offer great versatility for use on floors, walls, and more.

- 1. Frame It as Wall Art. Adding a trim of tile draws eyes to a mosaic graphic or mural, much like the frame on a painting.
- 2. Build Drama in Layers of Pattern. Mosaic field tile is lovely on its own or as a ground for more pattern. This jazzy Art Decostyle bath by designer Monique Gibson features an interlocking oval floor pattern of the same marble cladding walls.

- 4. Border a Backsplash. Repeating patterns brilliantly personalize traditional surface materials. Install them in a row above the counter for an eye-catching backsplash.


Metal mosaics take materials such as stainless steel and brass beyond their industrial roots to simply glamorous ends.
